e.x. "I am the best." "That's **cap**."

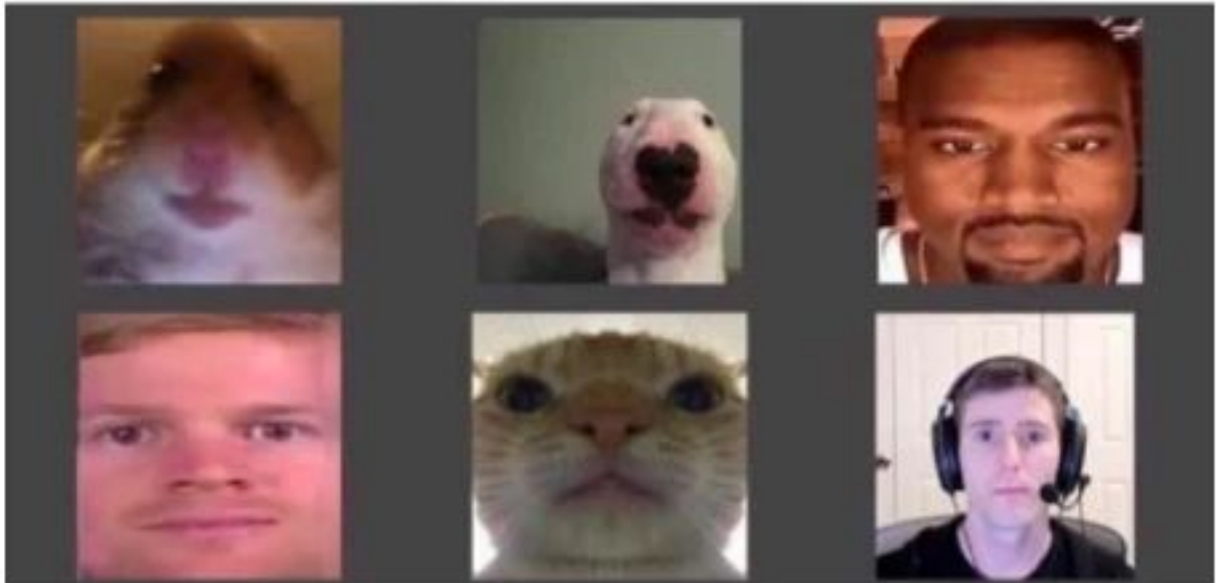
