

How to Make-Valentine's Day Cake Pops

INGREDIENTS

- 1 box super moist chocolate cake mix, such as Betty Crocker, follow directions on box
- 2 tsp instant coffee or espresso, this is optional. I used decaf instant coffee
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 tub fluffy or whipped chocolate frosting, such as Betty Crocker, follow directions on box you may not need the whole tub, you will know from the texture when mixing up. Start with half tub.

- white melting chocolate, I used pink Wilton Candy Melts
- dark melting chocolate
- 1 tsp shorting or coconut oil
- assorted sprinkles and nonpareils
- paper lollipop sticks
- Styrofoam block, found at most craft stores
- aluminum foil

How to Make-Valentine's Day Cake Pops - Part 2

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350
 degrees, spray a 9 x 13
 nonstick baking pan with
 cooking or baking spray.
 Set aside. Cover foam
 block with foil. Set that
 aside as well.
- In a large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients to dry mixture. Add vanilla and instant coffee if using.
- Bake cake as directed on box.
- Cool in pan on wire rack for 30 minutes, then invert and cool cake on rack until cooled completely.

- Line cookie sheet with waxed paper. With fingers, crumble cake into a large bowl. Add frosting; mix well with hands until dough forms. Roll into balls. Place on cookie sheet. Freeze about 15 minutes.
- In microwavable bowl, microwave white chocolate as directed on package. Stir in ½ teaspoon of the shortening or coconut oil until smooth and mixture slightly runs off spoon. Repeat with dark chocolate and remaining ½ teaspoon shortening.

How to Make-Valentine's Day Cake Pops - Part 3

Directions cont.

- Remove cake pops from freezer. For each pop, dip tip of 1 lollipop stick halfway into melted candy and insert stick halfway into 1 cake ball. Place back on lined cookie sheet.
- chocolate until well coated; tap off any excess.
 Decorate with decorations or opposite color of chocolate as desired. Poke ends of sticks into foam block. Let stand until set. You can pop them in the fridge for 5 minutes, then take them out. Store at room temperature.

Valentine's Day Cokies

INGREDIENTS

- 20.25 oz all-purpose flour,
 (4.5 cups)
- 2. 1 tsp salt
- 3. 1 tsp baking powder
- 4. 12.25 oz granulated sugar (1.75 cups)
- 5. 8 oz unsalted butter, (1 cup)
- 6. 2 large eggs
- 7. 1 tsp vanilla extract

Valentines Day Cookies 2 <u>Directions</u>

- In a bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt, and set aside for now.
- In the bowl of a large stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, combine the butter and sugar, and mix everything together on medium speed until fluffy and well-mixed, about 1-2 minutes.
- 3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then add the vanilla extract and buttermilk. With the mixer running on low, add the dry ingredients, and mix until they're just about incorporated. Stop the mixer when only a few streaks of flour remain. Scrape the bottom and sides of the bowl with a spatula, and finish mixing all the dough by hand.

Valentines Day Cookies 3 <u>Directions</u>

- 4. Divide the dough in half and press each into a thin disc, wrapping well with plastic wrap. Refrigerate until firmer but not hard, about 30 minutes.
- 5. When you're ready to bake the cookies, preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Place a disc of dough between two sheets of parchment or waxed paper, and roll out until it is 1/4-inch thick. Use a 3-inch heart cookie cutter to cut out your cookies and place them on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Combine the scraps and re-roll the dough to cut more cookies. You should get about 24 large heart cookies. Put the sheet in the freezer for 10 minutes before baking to help the cookies hold their shape.
- 6. Bake the trays of cookies for 10-12 minutes, until the edges are just starting to take on color and they have lost the raw shine in the middle. Let the cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes, then remove them to wire racks to cool completely before decorating them.


