

Mini Carrot Cake Cupcakes

Ingredients

Cupcakes-

- 1. 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2. 2 cups granulated sugar
- 3. 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 4. 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 5. 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 6. 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 7. 4 eggs
- 8. 1 cup vegetable oil
- 9. 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 10. 3 cups grated carrots, from about 6 5. medium carrots
- 11. 2 cup chopped pecans

Frosting

- 2. 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 3. 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened
- 4. 8 cups powdered sugar (confectioners' sugar)
- 5. 1 tablespoon milk

Mini Carrot Cake Cupcakes

Ingredients

- 1. Bake mini cupcakes. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Line two mini cupcake pans with liners.
- In a medium bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, baking soda and salt. Set aside.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, beat the eggs with an electric mixer on medium speed until foamy.
- 4. Add the oil in a thin stream and beat well. Beat in vanilla then gradually add the flour mixture to the egg mixture and mix well.
- 5. Fold in the carrots and pecans. Divide the batter into prepared pan cavities.
- 6. Bake for 10 to 14 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Allow the cupcakes to cool in the pan on a cooling rack for 5 minutes. Remove from the pan and cool completely before decorating.
- 7. Make cream cheese frosting. In a large bowl, beat butter and cream cheese with a stand mixer until light and fluffy.
- 8. Gradually add powdered sugar and milk. Beat on high until smooth (30 60 seconds). If frosting seems too thin, add powdered sugar 1 tablespoon at a time. If it seems too thick, add more milk 1 teaspoon at a time until frosting reaches desired consistency.
- 9. Decorate cupcakes. Prepare a decorating bag with cream cheese frosting. Cut 1/2 inch from the tip of the bag and pipe a swirl on each cupcake.
- 10. Carefully roll or sprinkle the edge of frosting with chopped pecans. Top with carrot candy decoration.






How to Draw a Stickman

1) Draw a Circle




2) Draw a line connected to the circle.

Easter Chocolate Chip Cookies

- Ingredients-
- 3/4 cup unsalted butter room temperature
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg room temperature
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp cornstarch
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 12 oz semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup M&Ms plus more to top the cookie if desired

Easter Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 1. Line a small baking sheet with parchment paper. Set aside.
- 2. Cream butter and sugars together in a large mixing bowl. Beat in the egg and vanilla until thoroughly combined.
- Whisk together flour, cornstarch, baking soda, and salt in a small bowl. 3.
- Gradually add flour mixture to wet ingredients, mixing just until 4. combined.
- 5. Fold in chocolate chips and M&Ms.
- 6. Scoop out about 2 tablespoons of cookie dough and roll into balls. Using a cookie scoop helps to keep the cookies a uniform size.
- 7. Place cookie dough balls on the prepared baking sheet and repeat until all dough has been used.
- 8. Cover the cookie dough balls with plastic wrap and freeze for at least an hour and up to overnight. If you freeze overnight, let cookie dough balls sit at room temperature for 10 minute before baking. (You can also transfer to a ziploc bag and bake as needed.)
- 9. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- Place cookie dough balls on a parchment lined baking sheet and bake 10. for 10 to 12 minutes. Cookies will appear slightly underbaked. Gently press additional candies and chocolate chips into the top of the cookies if desired.
- Let cookies cool for several minutes on baking sheet before 11. transferring to a cooling rack.
- Store in an airtight container for up to a week. 12.

Lincoln College Set to Close After 157 Years


- It has been announced that as of May 13, 2022, Lincoln College will be closed for good.
